- Media: *newspapers, magazines, television, radio and commercials.*

- Religion: *credos and social roots.*

- Languages: *use, diffusion and identity.*

#### ◎ Past and present events and personalities

Important events in the history of the Hispanic countries: eras, characters and relevance. Spain in the XX century: Primo de Rivera's dictatorship, the Second Republic, the Civil War, the Francoism, the Transition to democracy and the Democracy.

#### ◎ Cultural products and creations

Literature and thought: chronology, important authors and current view.

Music: chronology, authors and representative works. Popular and traditional music: the flamenco.

Cinema and theatre: chronology, directors and important films.

Architecture, painting, sculpture y photography: chronology, authors and salient works.

Celebrations and popular traditions: origin and current events.

Personal identification: names, surnames and identification documents.

Family: types and evolution.

Calendar, times and rhythm of life at work and during the free time.

Food and drink: places, social types and conventions associated.

Shopping: buildings, social conventions and consumption habits.

Social services: attention towards elderly people, immigrants, means less people and maltreated women.
